MDWs in Singapore(1)

Large numbers of women migrate to Singapore for domestic work

- Singapore had 247,400 MDWs as of Dec 2020
- 1 in 5 Singapore households hire an MDW
- Approx distribution by nationality: 48% Indonesia / 35% Philippines / 16 % Myanmar

97% migrate for economic reasons

- Average salaries in their home countries in 2015*:
 - Indonesians S\$164
 - Filipinos S\$214

vs S\$700 in Singapore**and growing

^{*}Survey by Farsight (2016); 4,000 MDWs, returned or prospective MDWs in Indonesia, Philippines, HK and Singapore **Aidha 2018-2020 data indicates \$702/month on average

MDWs in Singapore (2)

Challenging working conditions

- No limitation on daily hours worked average 13hrs/day
- 40% do not have a weekly day off
- Typically incur recruitment debt of \$2-3k (nearly half a year's wages) for first contract
- Legislation provides few rights or protection. Domestic workers excluded from Singapore Employment Act





Aidha Business Accelerator

The Aidha Business Accelerator provides support to Aidha alumni who aspire to set up or strengthen their business

'Runway' track

Alumni who are looking for support to get ready to start their business

'Take Off' track

Alumni who have a business in their home country (or planning to start within 3 months) and are looking to expand their business





Monthly workshops on advanced business topics **Specialised workshops with Aidha's partners Networking opportunities with Aidha alumni Network of experts and resource people**

One-to-one mentoring Up to \$2,500 in funding for each selected participant

Small group mentoring Preparation to move on to the 'Take Off' track in the future

Low Income Women's Programme

Aidha partners with others such as Daughters of Tomorrow to run a customised financial literacy programme for low income women in Singapore

'Managing my Money'

7 month programme of 10 face-to-face group sessions, designed to increase savings and build personal knowledge, behaviour and skills for long-term financial success.

Participants build a saving habit and make plans to develop a personal goal

Reducing debt
Investing in yourself
Creating a rainy day fund

Impact

- Confidence in managing money increased 42%
- Average monthly savings more than trebled, to \$156/month
- All participants found the course 'extremely useful' or 'very useful'
- All participants in debt were able to reduce their debt
- All participants have at least started an emergency fund






Monthly savings amongst students increase by 40% after Module 1 and by 78% amongst Aidha alumni

Ownership of Productive Assets



The number of productive assets owned (including a house/renovation, building, land, vehicle, livestock, machinery/equipment) doubles amongst alumni.

Business Ownership



Business ownership rises progressively, increasing from 6% for newly registered students to 43% amongst our alumni

Radliyah (2015), from Indonesia

- Liyah started work in Singapore in 2007 and had no savings when she joined Aidha in 2013
- In 2014, with her husband, she set up a guest house in Semarang, Central Java
- She has now opened a second guest house and returned to Indonesia in early 2020



Orphaned at 16, Nilu worked in a garment factory

Nilushika Jayaweera

(2012), from Sri Lanka

- Came to Singapore in 2003, sending back all her earnings until she joined Aidha in 2011
- Set up an online tea business and in 2016 was able to return home
- Spoke at TEDx
- Set up Emerging Hope Lanka in 2017, an NGO that supports women entrepreneurs
- Launched Nilu Tea (sold on Redmart!) in 2018



Tech Support for Online Classes



Aidha classes on Zoom

- Tech Support Volunteers will be working closely with Aidha students and mentors and will be coordinating with them before and during online classes to ensure that Aidha classes run smoothly and the students maximise their learning in the virtual space.
- Volunteers will be trained to troubleshoot technical difficulties the student usually face.
- Sessions are on Sundays, twice a month for a period of 6 months. Each session per module is 3 hours.
- Your engagement pattern could be flexible depending on your availability

About Personal Financial Plans & Business Plans

To graduate, all students must complete and submit a Personal Financial Plan for Module 2 or Business Plan for Module 3. The students' plans are assessed by their mentors and the top 2 or 3 students from each intake are entered into Aidha's Graduation competition.

Students will continue to refer to their Personal Financial Plans on their journey towards financial security and continue to use their Business Plans to successfully set up businesses back home.

 We sometimes need volunteers to support students in completing and presenting their plans, working one on one in our 'clinics'.




Ride for Aidha

Team Aidha traditionally cycles the 42km Sportive Ride, as part of OCBC Cycle:

- In November 2020 more than 135 riders completed their 'Ride for Aidha' in a virtual team ride over 2 weeks. We raised nearly \$30,000 to kickstart our Gift of Education campaign.
- In 2021, 106 riders signed up to 'Ride for Aidha' in a 4-week virtual team ride. Riders share the experience in a Strava Club and WhatsApp group. Our fundraising target is \$25,000.
- 16 students and alumnae took part in 2020 and 2021



1. 'Sunday Skills' activities to supplement the students' learning and improve their wellbeing

- Sessions on Sundays for 1- 2 hours, currently online.
